

# Sandwich South Bylaw No. 1026

**A BYLAW to provide for drainage work in the Township of Sandwich South in the County of Essex and for borrowing on the credit of the Municipality the sum of \$13,195.00, being the amount assessed against the lands and roads in the Township of Sandwich South for repairing and improving the Little River Drain.**

Provisionally adopted the 1st day of August, A.D., 1949.

Whereas Wilfred McCarthy, one of the owners, whose lands are assessed to the Little River Drain, served written notice on the Council of the said Township to repair the said drain, or otherwise he would hold the Township responsible for any damages from water.

And Whereas, thereupon the said council has procured an examination to be made by C. G. R. Armstrong, being a person competent for such purpose, of the said area proposed to be drained and the means suggested for the drainage thereof, and of other lands and roads liable for assessment under this Act, and has also procured plans, specifications and estimates of the drainage work to be made by the said C. G. R. Armstrong, and an assessment to be made by him of the lands and roads to be benefitted by such drainage work, and of other lands and roads liable for contribution thereto, stating as nearly as he can, the proportion of benefit outlet liability and injuring liability, which, in his opinion, will be derived or incurred in consequence of such drainage work by every road and lot or portion of lot, the said assessment so made being the assessment hereinafter by this bylaw enacted to be assessed and levied upon the roads and lots and parts of lots hereinafter in that behalf especially set forth and described, and the report of the said C. G. R. Armstrong in respect thereof, and of the said drainage work being as follows:

Windsor, Ontario, February 24th, 1949.

To the Reeve and Municipal Council of the Township of Sandwich South:

Gentlemen: In compliance with your instructions I have made an examination, survey, etc., of the Little River Drain, in your township, and its outlet in the Township of Sandwich East, and now report thereon as follows:

I commenced my survey of this drain at its upper end on the northerly side of the road north of the North Talbot road lots. Thence I followed the course of the present drain, down stream, to near the Third Concession Road, in the Township of Sandwich East.

I find that this drain was last improved under a report made by J. J. Newman, C.E., dated March 6th, 1939. I also find that a considerable amount of sediment has accumulated in the drain since that time and brush and rubbish have been allowed to grow and accumulate so that the drain is not adequate to properly drain the lands it was intended to drain.

I further find that this drain bends

northwesterly from near the limit between lots 13 and 14 in the 9th Concession and at the Blind Line, and then runs northerly, more or less parallel with the Blind Line (a short distance west thereof) to a point a short distance south of the Base Line Road where it again crosses the Blind Line. The present location of the drain as above described, does not lend itself to the free flow of the water as the location along the Blind Line would permit and I would recommend that a new course be constructed for this drain so that the drain will continue along the Blind Line in the 9th Concession.

In order to overcome these difficulties I would recommend that the drain be relocated as above described and as staked on the ground and that the remaining portion of this drain be cleaned out, repaired and improved all in accordance with the accompanying profile and specifications.

I also find that it will be necessary to improve the drain across the right-of-way of the Hydro-Electric Power Commission of Ontario. My estimate of the cost of doing this portion of the work is \$390.00. My estimate of the cost for doing the same portion of the work, if the Power Line was not there is \$300.00. Thus the increased cost caused by the construction and operation of the Hydro Electric Power Commission is \$90.00.

This last mentioned amount I have assessed against the Hydro-Electric Power Commission of Ontario, to be borne and contributed by it in case it does not exercise its option of doing the said work within a reasonable time and without any unnecessary delay. Should the Hydro-Electric Power Commission exercise its option and complete this portion of the drain, then the special assessment of \$90.00 should be deleted from the Schedule of Assessment and the Commission will be paid \$300.00.

I also find that it will be necessary to improve the drain across the right-of-way of the Canadian Pacific Railway Company.

My estimate of the cost of doing this portion of the work is \$150.00. My estimate of the cost for doing the same portion of the work, if the Railway was not there, is \$60.00. Thus, the increased cost caused by the construction and operation of the Canadian Pacific Railway is \$90.00. This last mentioned amount I have assessed against the Canadian Pacific Railway Company to be borne and contributed by it in case it does not exercise its option of doing the work within a reasonable time and without any unnecessary delay. Should the railway Company exercise its option and complete this portion of the drain, then the special assessment of \$90.00 should be deleted from the Schedule of Assessment and the Railway Company should be paid \$60.00.

I further find that each of the following owners is entitled to and should receive the following compensation for damages to land and crops (if any) and for land taken for the construction of the drain:

I have provided for these in my estimates as is provided for in Sub-section 7 of Section 8 of the Municipal Drainage Act.

My estimate of the cost of the whole of the above work, including all incidental expenses, is the sum of \$15,136.00, made up as follows:

## Sandwich South Township.

Excavation—Sec. 1, from station 0 to station 78, 7,800 ft., \$1,700; Sec. 2, from station 78 to station 119+70', 4,170 ft., \$3,800; Sec. 3, from station 122 to station 165+88', 4,388 ft., \$1,170. Total for excavation, \$6,670.00.

Removing and replacing fences, \$260; brushing and grubbing, \$620; damages to land and crops (if any), \$447.

Total for construction, damages, etc., \$7,997.00.

Sec. 4 — From station 165+88' to station 166+88', 100 ft. (across Town-line road), \$100.00.

## Sandwich East Township.

Excavation—from station 166+88' to station 262, 9,512 ft. (exclusive of C. P. Rly), \$4,200; Crossing Canadian Pacific Railway right-of-way, \$150; crossing Hydro-Electric Power Commission right-of-way, \$390; removing and replacing fences, \$75; brushing and grubbing, \$80; damages to lands and crops (if any), \$339. Total for construction, damages, etc., \$5,234.00.

Total for construction, damages, etc., \$13,331.00.

Incidentals—Surveys (including alternate route), plans, estimates, report and assessment, \$740; assistance and expenses, \$210; extra work for Clerk, Sandwich South, \$100; publish-



ing Bylaw, Sandwich South, \$95; Court of Revision Sandwich South, \$30; Ontario Municipal Board fee, Sandwich South, \$10; serving copy on Sandwich East Township, \$5; extra work for Clerk, Sandwich East, \$60; publishing Bylaw, Sandwich East, \$40; Court of Revision, Sandwich East, \$30; Ontario Municipal Board fee, Sandwich East, \$5; letting and superintending, \$480. Total for incidentals, \$1,805.00. Total estimate, \$15,136.00.

This amount I have assessed against the lands and roads affected, in accordance with the accompanying Schedule of Assessment.

I would further recommend that this drainage work be kept up and maintained by the Township of Sandwich South, from station 0 to the north side of the North Townline Road (King's Highway No. 2) at the expense of the lands and roads in the Township of Sandwich South in any way assessed herein for its repair and improvement, and in the proportions herein contained until otherwise determined under the provisions of the Municipal Drainage Act.

I would also recommend that that portion of the drain, from the north side of the North Townline Road (King's Highway No. 2) to the end of the proposed work (west of the Lauzon Road) to be kept up and maintained by the Township of Sandwich East, at the expense of the lands and roads in each Township, and in the proportions herein contained until otherwise determined under the provisions of the Municipal Drainage Act.

All of which is respectfully submitted.

Specifications for Repairing and Improving the Little River Drain, in the Township of Sandwich South, and in the Township of Sandwich East.

The drain shall follow the course of the present drain except from Station 78 to station 122 on the old course; this latter station is at station 119+70' on the new course. That is, from station 78 to station 119+70' the drain shall be re-located immediately west of the Blind Line; it shall be located so that the easterly top edge of the finished drain is five feet (5') west of the wire fence and its production, on the Blind Line.

The drain shall be constructed to the depths as shown on the accompanying profile, and the cuts are to be taken from the ground beside the stakes.

From station 0 to the line between lots 10 and 11, the excavated earth shall be cast to either or both side of the drain as directed by the Commissioner in charge. Where the drain passes along the south side of the line between lots 10 and 11, the excavated earth shall be cast onto the adjoining lands to the south. From station 13+09' to station 78, the excavated earth shall be cast onto the adjoining lands to the east. Up to this last mentioned station the excavated earth shall be well and evenly spread over a sufficient space so that no portion of the

excavated earth is more than twelve inches (12") in depth and kept at least five feet (5') clear from the edge of the drain, care being taken not to fill up any existing ditches, furrows or drains with the excavated material. For that portion of the drain as located in its new position, the excavated earth shall be deposited on the ground immediately west of the newly constructed drain and left neatly piled so that the owners of the adjacent lands may have ready access to the excavated earth in order that they may fill the location of the present Little River Drain where it crosses their lands. The earth so piled by the contractor shall be such that the toe of the easterly slope is at least five feet (5') clear of the newly excavated drain.

From station 122 to station 207+45', at the westerly side of the Lauzon Road, the excavated earth shall be cast to either side of the drain as directed by the commissioner and well and evenly spread over a sufficient space so that no portion of the excavated earth is more than 20" in depth and kept at least four feet (4') clear from the edge of the drain, care being taken not to fill up any existing ditches, furrows or drains with the excavated material.

Where the drain runs northerly along the westerly side of the Lauzon Road, the excavated earth shall be cast to the adjoining lands to the west and spread as directed for the immediately preceding section.

For the balance of the drain the excavated earth shall be cast to either side of the drain as directed by the Commissioner in charge and spread as specified in the immediate adjacent section.

When there is any brush or rubbish in the course of the drain or where the earth is to be spread, all such brush and rubbish shall be grubbed out of the drain and close cut where the earth is to be spread, the whole to be burned or otherwise satisfactorily disposed of by the contractor.

Where there are any trees or stumps in the course of the drain the Contractor will be required to cut down the trees and grub out the stumps and will be required to haul the trees out of the way of the excavated earth and shall leave the trees on the lands of the adjoining owner. The owner shall have the option of utilizing the wood from these trees for his own use and he shall indicate his wish in this matter to the contractor, and if he does not wish to utilize the wood from the trees for his own use, then the Contractor will be required to trim up the trees and burn or otherwise satisfactorily dispose of the brush therefrom, and in return, the contractor may have the wood therefrom for his use, and in all cases the contractor will be required to burn or otherwise satisfactorily dispose of the stumps removed by him.

When it is necessary to take down any fence or remove any bridge in order to proceed with the work, the same shall be done by the contractor, and when that portion of the work is completed, the said fence or bridge shall be replaced in a neat and work-

manlike manner by the contractor, but he will not be required to procure any new material for rebuilding said fence or bridge, provided he has used reasonable care in removing and replacing the same.

The contractor's attention is directed that he will be required to straighten the course of the drain during the excavation operations. His attention is especially directed to that portion of the drain between stations 131 and 132 and between stations 226 and 231. He shall take the excavation from that side of the drain which shall tend to straighten the course of the drain and to prevent scouring on the opposite bank.

The attention of the contractor is drawn to the fact that there is a water well and windmill near the new location of the drain at station 118. This windmill will be on the east side of the newly located drain and care must be taken to protect the windmill and water well from damage during the course of the work.

The whole of the work shall be done in a neat thorough and workmanlike manner, to the full satisfaction of the Commissioner or Engineer in charge.

Monthly estimates will be furnished the contractor by the Commissioner or Engineer in charge. Said estimates shall be not more than 80% of the value of the work done, but the paying of the full 80% does not imply that any portion of the work has been accepted. The remaining 20% will be paid thirty (30) days after the final completion and acceptance of the contract.

And whereas, the said Council is of opinion that the drainage of the areas described is desirable.

And whereas a copy of the Engineer's report was duly served on the Township of Sandwich East, the Canadian Pacific Railway Co. and the Hydro-Electric Power Commission of Ontario.

Therefore, the said Municipal Council of the said Township of Sandwich South, pursuant to the provisions of the Municipal Drainage Act, enacts as follows:

1st. The said report, plans, specifications assessments and estimates are hereby adopted and the drainage work as herein indicated and set forth shall be made and constructed in accordance therewith.

2nd. The Reeve of the said Township may borrow on the credit of the Corporation of the said Township of Sandwich South, the sum of \$13,195.00, being the estimated cost of repairing the Little River Drain, and may issue debentures of the corporation to that amount in sums of not less than \$50 each, and payable within 10 years from the date thereof, with interest at the rate of 5 per centum per annum that is to say, in 10 equal instalments of principal and interest combined, such debentures to be payable at the Canadian Bank of Commerce, in the City of Windsor, and to have attached to them coupons for payment of interest.



3rd. For paying the sum of \$3,055.00, the amount charged against the said lands and roads for benefit, and the sum of \$8,477.00, the amount charged against the said lands and roads for outlet liability, and the sum of \$..... the amount charged against the said lands and roads for injuring liability, apart from the lands and roads belonging to or controlled by the municipality, and for covering interest thereon for 10 years at the rate of 5 per centum per annum; the total special rate over and above all other rates, shall be assessed, levied and collected (in the same manner and at the same time as other taxes are levied and collected), upon and from the undermentioned lots or parts of lots and roads, and the amount of the said total special rates and interest shall be divided into 10 equal parts and one such part shall be assessed, levied and collected as aforesaid in each year for 10 years after the final passing of this bylaw, during which the said debentures have to run.

4th. For paying the sum of \$1,693.00, the amount assessed against the said roads and lands of the Municipality, and for covering interest thereon for 10 years at the rate of 5 per centum per annum, a special rate on the dollar, sufficient to produce the required yearly amount therefor, shall, over and above all other rates, be levied and collected (in the same manner and at the same time as taxes are levied and collected), upon and from the whole rateable property in the said Township of Sandwich South in each year for 10 years after the final passing of this bylaw, during which the said debentures have to run.

5th. That a copy of this bylaw shall be served upon each of the several owners, their lessees or occupants, or upon the agent or agents of such owners of land assessed under its provisions, under the authority of Section 24 of the Municipal Drainage Act, and

this bylaw shall come into force upon and after the final passing thereof, and may be cited and referred to as "The Little River Repairs Bylaw."

6th. That C. G. R. Armstrong is hereby appointed commissioner to let the contract for the said drain and works connected therewith, by public auction or tender, to the lowest bidder (not exceeding the estimate), but every such contractor, with two good and satisfactory sureties, shall be required forthwith to enter into bonds for the due performance and completion of the contract according to said plans and specifications and within the time mentioned within such bond, unless otherwise ordered by the Council and it shall be the duty of such Commissioner to cause said drain and works connected therewith, to be made and constructed in accordance with such plans and specifications (unless otherwise ordered by the Council), and to grant certificates to the Treasurer from time to time, to each contractor, less 20 per cent of the amount due, until the contract is fully completed and duly accepted.

7th. The Corporation shall have the right, at its option, to redeem only the last debenture, bearing the latest maturity date, and no other of the said debentures shall be redeemable, on any date prior to maturity at the places where and in the moneys in which the said debentures are expressed to be payable, upon payment of the principal amount thereof, together with interest accrued to the date of redemption and upon giving previous notice of said intention to redeem by advertising once in the Ontario Gazette and once in a daily newspaper, of general provincial circulation, published in the City of Toronto, and once in a local newspaper, such notice to be advertised as aforesaid at least thirty days before the date fixed for redemption. Notice of intention so to redeem shall also be sent by post,

at least thirty days prior to the date set for such redemption, to each person in whose name a debenture so to be redeemed is registered at the address shown in the Debenture Registry Book.

And further notice is hereby given that any person intending to have such bylaw or any part thereof quashed must, not later than ten days after the final passing thereof, serve a notice in writing, upon the Reeve or other head officer, and upon the Clerk of the Municipality of Sandwich South of his intention to make application for that purpose, to the Drainage Referee during the six weeks next ensuing the final passing of this bylaw.
