BY-LAW No. 1078

SPECIFICATIONS for repairing and improving the West Branch of the Delisle Drain, in the Township of Sandwich South.

The drain shall follow the course of The drain shall follow the course or the present drain from Stake 0 to Stake 126. It shall be of the size, depth, etc., shown on the accompany-ing profile and the depths are to the bottom of the drain and are taken from the surface of the ground be-side the stakes side the stakes.

The drain shall have a uniform and even bottom and in no case shall such bottom project above the grade line shown on the profile as determined by the bench marks.

It shall have uniform and even side slopes of not less than one and one-quarter horizontal to one foot verti-cal on each side. The excavated earth shall be cast onto the lands where damages have been allowed in this report, and shall be well and even n read.

excavated material. Where the drain passes along the southerly side of the Talbot Road (King's Highway No. 3), from Stake 44+75' to Stake 52+80', the excavat-ed earth shall be hauled away and dis-posed of by the Contractor at his own expense.

Where the drain runs south from Stake $52+80^{\circ}$ to Stake $74+80^{\circ}$, the excavated earth shall ge cast easterly onto the lane and graded as above

onto the lane and graded as above specified. Where it is necessary to take down any fence in order to proceed with the work, the same shall be done by the Contractor and when he has comthe contractor and when he has com-pleted that portion of the work, he will replace the said fence in a neat and workmanlike manner, but will not be required to procure any new ma-terial for so doing, provided he has used reasonable care in removing and replacing the same

replacing the same. The Contractor's attention is direct-ed to the existence of the Bell Tele-phone Cable crossing the drain at Stake 93+55'. He shall take care not damage this cable. Where there is any brush, rubbish

where there is any brush, rubbish or trees in the course of the drain, or where the earth is to be spread, all such brush and rubbish and trees shall be grubbed out of the drain and close cut where the earth is to be spread, the whole to be burned or otherwise satisfactorily disposed of by the Con-tractor tractor.

The Contractor will be required to remove the present Access Culvert in front of E. Pt. of Lot 5, Con. 9, owned by Joseph Dureno, and to fur-nish and install in the same location a 24" corrugated Pipe Culvert, 20 ft. long. He shall lay the culvert so that the bottom is three inches (3") be-low the bottom of the ditch at the lo-cation of the culvert. He shall thor-The travelled portion of the order calls of the culvert. The shall thor-oughly tamp the backfill into posi-tion around and over the culvert and grade same so as to provide easy ac-cess from the lands of the owner to the travelled portion of the road.

Monthly estimates will be furnish-ed the Contractor by the Commission-er. 
