# **Township of Sandwich South** BY-LAW NO. 576

A BY-LAW to provide for Drainage Work in the Township of Sandwich South, in the County of Essex, and for borrowing on the credit of the Municipality the sum of \$648.20, being the portion of the estimated cost assessed against the lands and roads in Sandwich South for repairing the North Town Line Drain.

Provisionally adopted the 14th day of June, A.D., 1926.

Whereas, written notice was served on the Municipal Council of the Town-ship of Sandwich South by W. Mc-Mullin, G. E. Willis and others that the North Town Line Drain was badly out of repair.

<sup>\*</sup> And whereas, thereupon the said council has procured an examination be made by Jas. S. Laird, being a person competent for such purpose, of the said area proposed to be drained, and the means suggested for the drainage thereof, and of other lands and roads liable to assessment under this act, and has also procured plans, specifications and estimates of the drainage work to be made by the said Engineer, and an assessment to be made by him of the lands and roads to be benefitted by such drainwork and other lands and roads liable for contribution thereto, stating as nearly as he can, the proportion of benefit, outlet liability, and injur-ing liability, which in his op-inion, will be derived or incurred in consequence of such drainage work by every road and lot or portion of lot, the said assessment so made being the assessment hereinafter by this by-law enacted to be assessed and levied upon the roads and lots or parts of lots hereinafter in that behalf especially set forth and described, and the report of the said Engineer, in respect thereof, and of the said drainwork being as follows:

To the Reeve and Municipal Councillors of the Township of Sandwich South.

### Gentlemen.-

Acting under your instructions have made a survey and examined the North Town Line Drain in your township and beg to report thereon as follows:-

I find that the said North Town Line Drain in its present condition is not deep enough to give a proper ontlet to the covered drains on the W 1-2 of Lot 17, in the 7th Con. of said Township said Township.

I, therefore, recommend that the said North Town Line Drain be cleaned out and otherwise improved from the head of said drain at the 7th Con. Road East 336 rods to 52 rods East of the 8th Con. Road. The said improvement to be made in strict accordance with the profile and specifications of same attached hereto.

I have, in the estimates, provided \$80.25 to pay for damages (if any) caused by spreading the earth on lands and crops and I also have pro-vided \$51.00 to pay for moving and putting back fences, all to be paid as given on the annexed specifications.

The lots and parts of lots that will in any way be affected by said improvement I have assessed for benefit with the sum of \$315.15 and for outlet for the waters from said lands with the sum of \$200.25

As the township of Sandwich East Town Line Road as the Township of Sandwich South I have assessed the Township of Sandwich East for benefit to their South town line road with the sum of \$39.80 and for outlet for the waters from said town line with the sum of \$24. #### SPECIFICATIONS

Specifications of the proposed cleaning out and improving of part of the North Town Line Drain in the Township of Sandwich South.

This improvement commences at the East End of the pipe across the 7th Con. Road and follows the old drain on the South Side of the said North Town Line East to 52 rods East of the East limit of the 8th Con. Road. Side slopes as follows: -Give the land side a good 1 14 to I slope while the road side shall not be touched except to give what you deepen it a 1 14 to 1 slope. Bottom width from the 7th Con. Road to the 8th Con. Road 2 1-2 feet and East of the 8th Con. Band 2 feet the 8th Con. Road 3 feet.

The earth taken from the said Drain shall all be cast south in the fields, keep back 5 feet from the edge of the finished drain and grade evenly over 30 feet. Except in front of several houses, where the earth shall be disposed of as will be directed by the commissioners in charge of the repairs.

The following named parties shall receive the sums placed after their names, for spreading earth on their lands and crops and for moving and putting back fences.

Survey, plans, profiles, estimates, assessment, etc. \$73; Paid men assisting, stakes, expenses, etc. \$12.35; Extra work for clerk, \$30; Publishing bylaw, \$30; Court of Re-Publishing bylaw, \$30; Court of Re-vision, \$20; Letting and Superintend-ing, \$42.20; Serving report on Sand-wish East Twp., \$3. Total Cost, \$712.00.

And whereas, the said Council is of opinion that the drainage of the areas described is destrable.

Therefore the said Municipal Council of the said Township of Sandwich South pursuant to the provisions of the Municipal Drainage Act, enacts as fellows:-

1st. The said report, plans, specifications, assessments and estimates are hereby adopted and the drainage work as therein indicated and set forth shall be made and constructed in accordance therewith.

2nd. The Reeve of the said Township may borrow on the credit of the corporation of the said Township of Sandwich South the sum of \$648.20, being the portion of the estimated cost assessed against the lands and roads in the Township of Sandwich South, and may issue debentures of the Corporation to that amount in sums of not less than \$50 each, and payable within 10 years from the date thereof, with interest at the rate of 6 per centum per annum, that is to say in 10 equal instalments, such debentures to be payable at the Canadian Bank of Commerce in the City of Windsor, and to have attached to them coupons for the payment of interest.

3rd For paying the sum of \$315.15 the amount charged against the said lands for benefit, and the sum of \$200.25, the amount charged against the said lands for outlet liability, apart from the lands and roads belong-ing to or controlled by the municipal-ity and for covering interest thereon and for covering interest thereon for 10 years at the rate of 6 per centum per annum; the total special rate over and above all other rates, shall be assessed, levied and collected (in the same manner and at the same time as other taxes are levied and collected), upon and from the undermentioned lots and parts of lots, and the amount of the said special rates and interest shall be divided into 10 and interest shall be divided into 10 equal parts, and one such part shall be assessed, levied and collected as aforesaid in each year for 10 years after the final passing of this by-law, during which the said debentures have to run
