

King's Navy Yard Park pioneer mourned by residents

AMHERSTBURG - A former Essex County warden and ERCA chair who was also one of the pioneers of the King's Navy Yard Park is being mourned by those in the town who knew him.

Bob Pulleyblank, who served

as reeve of Sandwich South from 1965 to 1979 and was county warden in 1971, died last Thursday at the age of 75. However, he may be best known in Amherstburg for the care he took of Navy Yard Park through the business he owned, Suburban Landscaping.

"Through my association with Bob over the years, he always expressed first and foremost his love and devotion towards his family," said retired town clerk/ administrator Tom Kilgallin. "He very much cared for others and was always willing to assist others."

Kilgallin said Pulleyblank and his company worked for the town for roughly 20 years and

was responsible for care and maintenance of the Navy Yard Park and other parks in town. Kilgallin said Pulleyblank would often perform work and upgrades to the park at no cost to the town.

"Bob typified the best of public service," he said. "He carried his work out with gentle persistence, great charm, often with good humor and a genuine love of horticulture. Bob's professional skills and love and devotion to the care and maintenance of our parks was exemplary."

Kilgallin said he felt "honored and privileged" to have known Pulleyblank and his family over the years.

"On many occasions, he inspired me as to the importance and commitment and dedications to community service as a civil servant," said Kilgallin. "Bob always displayed a positive attitude and possessed superior supervisory and leadership skills. He was always so well respected by his support staff."

Pulleyblank was loved and

respected by the residents of Amherstburg for his patience and his willingness to pass along his horticultural knowledge, Kilgallin added. To recognize Pulleyblank's love and dedication to Navy Yard Park, a coffee tree was planted in his honor in the park several years ago.

"In many ways, Bob Pulleyblank was a father figure to me and my memories of Bob will always be cherished. Bob will truly be missed!" said Kilgallin.


Oldcastle businessman, service club volunteer and municipal government leader Robert "Bob" Pulleyblank was laid to rest last week after a lengthy battle with a rare type of bone cancer. Bob not only founded his Suburban Landscape business but was a founding member of the Essex Region Conservation Authority. As an active member of the Goodfellows, Bob recently helped establish the Essex Chapter of the organization. He served as Reeve of Sandwich South from 1965 to 1979. Town resident Harold Maenpaa, served on Sandwich South Council beginning in 1966, the year that a remnant of Sandwich East (the Tecumseh hamlet area between County Roads 22 and 42) was turned over to Sandwich South. Mr. Maenpaa recalls that it was Bob who encouraged him to sit on council and represent this new end of the township that was heavily populated. "He was a proper gentleman, I enjoyed working with him and I got a wealth of knowledge from Bob," Harold says, recalling the evenings they played cards at the Pulleyblanks after a council meeting.





Ray Robinet's first years on council were served as Deputy Reeve for the last two years of Bob's tenure in municipal government. "Bob was really helpful... I knew nothing. He was a kind-hearted person," Ray remembers. "He was a shrewd businessman and brought that to handling the Township's spending. He wasn't afraid to make tough decision and he wasn't afraid to express his opinions," said Ray, noting that it was Bob Pulleyblank who advocated strongly for the proper outfitting of a new fire station for the Township at Walker Road and Highway #3. "It was built after he left, but that was something Bob pushed to make happen."

Goodfellows always remembered

Bob Pulleyblank and Wilber Brett

It was 2005 and things were not good.

Don Meloche, volunteer coordinator of the McGregor St. Vincent de Paul Food Bank, was getting concerned. The service organization that helped fund the food bank had folded.

"I was trying to figure out where we could get some help to fill this gap," Don said. "Then I got a call from Bob Pulleyblank."

Bob had some experience with lending a helping hand to the needy. He had started preparing Christmas food baskets back in the 1960s, along with friend Grant McKee. In the years following, with the assistance of the Sandwich South Fire Department, he helped raised hundreds of thousands of dollars for the Goodfellows organization.

Don listened as Bob laid out plans to create an Essex Region Goodfellows. It was a plan to direct better service to the needy in the county, and he wanted to assist the McGregor food bank.

"Just the idea put tears in my eyes," Don said. "It has just been a godsend for us."

Bob also recruited Wilber Brett, retired publisher of *The Essex Free Press*. The Essex Region Goodfellows were going to need their own newspaper. The two men were well known to each other. Both had served in local government, at the municipal and county levels. Both were devoted volunteers to numerous organizations in their communities, Bob in Sandwich South and Wilber in Essex. They set about assembling a team and the Essex Region Goodfellows became a reality.

In that first year, 2005, the Essex Region Goodfellows raised about \$20,000 – a remarkable feat for a fledgling organization. Besides McGregor, it supported the Essex Area Food Bank, Harrow St. Vincent de Paul Food Bank and the Essex Salvation Army Food Bank. Last year, about \$45,000 was raised, adding up to a five-year total of \$176,000.

Sadly, Wilber passed away on Nov. 12, 2009, and Bob followed on July 22, 2010. Both men had lost their battles with cancer. But as Goodfellows, they had lived to see a victory in providing for the needy – far beyond their expectations. They had also passed the torch to other Goodfellows, volunteers and their families.

Bob had inspired his daughter, Wendy Pulleyblank, to promote the Goodfellows and their cause.

"My father raised awareness of the need to feed the hungry in our own backyard," Wendy said. "He was the epitome of a volunteer."

Wendy said her father was affectionately known as "Big Bad Bob."

"He was strong-willed but his heart had the right intentions," she said. "I give him credit for raising funds – he pushed us to keep raising the bar."

"The torch is passed to his grandchildren, Justin and Jeff Pulleyblank,"

Wendy said. Justin has proudly taken up Bob's post on the board.

Just as Bob had inspired Wendy, Wilber had inspired his daughter, Laurie

Brett, to take up the cause for the less fortunate.

"My father always felt the Goodfellows was an excellent fit for our newspaper," Laurie said. "Being able to get the news about hunger and want out to the community is so important."

Wilber and Bob were a remarkable team, Laurie said.

"Both men were active in their community, deeply involved in public service, respected statesmen."

The code of the Goodfellows states that the Goodfellow shares, understands, cares, and lends a helping hand to the less fortunate; they are a friend and a neighbour – a Good
